Agenda – open meeting

1) Approval of minutes/agenda /Lasse The agenda was approved.

The minutes was approved, but aligned with the time schedule, which means $_{SIDE 2 AF 4}$ that some of the items would be postponed due to time constraints

The minutes from 25. June approved.

2) Course Evaluation/Merlin (10:10-10:45/35 min)

Generally, the ratings of the courses have been good. Three of the courses taught in the spring 2024, have got an A, and the rest obtained B. None got C-ratings.

Also, the Evaluation frequency has been high. 58.1 per cent of the students have evaluated the courses, which is above both the faculty average (43.1 per cent), and the faculty's target (50 per cent).

Overall, the study boards conversations highlighted areas for improvement, including course structure, relevance, workload, and coherence. Suggestions were also made to make some courses electives and/or to better integrate course content with students' learning needs.

Within the limited time allocated to the item, the study board managed to deal with the following courses:

- Critical Reading and Re-analysis. It was considered to make it an elective
- Knowledge, Organization and Politics.
- Recent Advanced quantitative research strategies. The course had some issues with relevance and connection between parts. Improvements were suggested for better integration.
- Applied Case Analysis The course faced structural problems and a high workload. Suggestions included moving it to a different semester and linking it more closely to sociology.
- Sociology of Gender and Sexuality: The course title was seen as misleading, focusing more on heterogeneity. More detailed notes on PowerPoints were suggested.

- Sociological Theory and Developments: The course was intense but _{SIDE 3 AF 4} generally well-received. A clearer framework for comparison and relevance was suggested.
- Gender, Ethnicity, and Post-colonialism: It was suggested to reduce the number of readings and focus on the most important texts.
- Critical Theory: Capitalism, Democracy, and Intersectionality: Students found it hard to form groups. More support for group formation was therefore suggested.
- Basic Statistics: The course had minor issues and had significantly improved compared to previous evaluations.
- Experimental Sociology: Peer feedback was not well-received, but anyway the course was the 4th best evaluated course offered at Sociology.
- Sociological Theory and History: The course had a lot of readings and was challenging but also well-structured.
- Science and Society: Good Scientific Praxis in the 21 centuries.

Due to time constraints the remaining evaluation results were postponed to the next study board meeting.
